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Welcome to the Boys & Girls Clubs 2022 Summer Programming!

Welcome to a new summer with the Boys & Girls Club of Riverton! It is our pleasure to serve your children. Our summer will be full of fun and excitement!

This packet provides important information about our camp policies. Our staff is looking forward to providing the best experience for your child this summer! Your assistance will help us achieve this.

Hours/Late Fees

7:30 am – 5:30 pm

Any child not picked up by closing time, pm, will be charged a \$10 late fee for every additional 5 minutes he/she is left at the Club (beginning with the first minute). This fee must be paid before the member is allowed to return to the program. If your child is left for more than one hour past closing, the proper authorities will be notified.

Payment/Weekly Balances

The summer camp fee is \$50 per child per week or \$10 per day. A EDODØH payment of \$40 is required the Friday before the week your child is expected to attend.

In order for your child to attend any camp week, full payment must be received NO LATER than the Monday morning of that week. Lack of payment will result in your child(ren) not being able to attend Club that week.

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Refund Policy

If a child is unable to attend camp, **no refund will be given for the annual \$10 membership fee.** No refund will be given if a child is removed from the camp in the event of disciplinary actions. A \$30 processing fee will be applied to any applicable refund.

Drop-off /Pick-up

Upon arrival and departure to and from Clubs, parents/guardians must come in to check-in and check-out with a staff member.

The Boys & Girls Club is a drop-in facility and has an open-door policy where members are advised to stay on Club premises; however, we cannot legally require a member to stay at their Club. Staff does not grant permission to leave nor do we insist that children stay. Arrival and departure is a matter

strictly between parent/guardian and the child(ren). We will, however, be monitoring the entrance of the building. As always, safety for our members is our top priority. If you have a specific concern, please notify the Site Director.

Discipline

The goal of our summer program is to provide members with an atmosphere of fun, creativity, and respect through meaningful supervised experiences, which will encourage positive personal development. Please feel free to speak with the Site Director about our discipline policy. Your cooperation will assist us in achieving these goals.

The Boys & Girls Club of Riverton enforces the following codes of conduct:

1. Respect for self, other members, staff, and property.
2. Threats, violence, and foul language will not be tolerated.

The Boys & Girls Club staff is instructed to take the following disciplinary actions:

1. Verbal warning, time outs, Club service,
2. Parental notification, (It is the discretion of the Site Director to give suspensions)
3. Dismissal from all Boys & Girls Clubs summer sites,
4. Fighting is an automatic two-day suspension.

Sick Policy

No child will be admitted to camp if any of the following conditions are present:

1. A contagious disease, (i.e. COVID-19, chicken pox, cold/flu, head lice, etc.)
2. Any fever over 100 degrees; member will not be admitted back until fever free for more than 24 hours,
3. Excessive sneezing or coughing,
4. Signs of vomiting and/or diarrhea.

A child will be sent home if any of the above conditions occur at Club. There is a space provided on the membership application for alternate emergency phone numbers. Ill children must be picked up within one hour. There will be a \$5 charge for every 10 minutes past one hour that the member is left at the facility.

Medication

If your child requires medication, we prefer it is taken outside of Club hours. If it is necessary to bring medication to the Club, for the safety of all, please alert the Site Director to discuss a secure location to keep the medication while your child is at the Club. However, our policies do not allow for staff to administer medication so it will be your child's responsibility to remember to administer the medication him/herself.

Personal Items

We encourage your child to bring only the necessities to the Club, as there will be no locked storage available. If your child decides to bring personal items, the Boys & Girls Club of Riverton will not be responsible for lost, stolen, or damaged items. Children are discouraged from bringing cell phones, tablets, or any other gaming devices to the Clubs!

We do, however, encourage you to send your child(ren) with a hat and sunscreen.

Lunch/Snacks

Your child will be provided a healthy morning snack, lunch, and afternoon snack. Lunches will be served at Rendezvous Elementary School.

Field trips may be offered. These trips may include the library, movies, museums, nature walks, water days, swimming and much more! Nominal fees may be required for some field trips. Please contact your site for scheduling and fee information.

Attention Parents

Summer Camp Fees:

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Fees are expected to be paid the **FRIDAY BEFORE** the week you plan to attend. Full week's payment is due no later than the **MONDAY morning** of the week you plan to attend, unless payment arrangements are made **IN ADVANCE**.

At registration, a \$10 reservation fee is required for each week your child will attend. This secures a spot for your child in our camp. Those who pay in advance and who have paid the reservation fee have preference. If a camp site reaches capacity, members without a paid reservation fee may not be allowed to attend their preferred site. This reservation fee is **non-refundable** and **non-transferable** and is applied to that week's camp fee.

REMINDER:

For the safety of your child, a parent or guardian **MUST** accompany all camp participants into and out of the Club each day. **DO NOT** park or drop off children along the sidewalk or bus lanes. Park in designated parking spots at all sites.
